Over 2 million new cases of Breast Cancer were diagnosed in women in 2020, worldwide. Cancer care remains a priority and many countries have developed National Cancer care plans, strategies, and policies to combat the growing burden. However, despite the adoption of such policies and plans, there is still a gap in implementing them. What are some of the main challenges in translating policy to practice for Breast Cancer and how can we overcome them?
